

Belmont Wetlands

Belmont Wetlands State Park comprises seven coastal wetlands, some of which drain into Lake Macquarie. It is the largest single open water wetland in Lake Macquarie and is fed by an extensive wetland system from the north and north east.

Belmont Wetlands also has sites of value to our cultural heritage, with evidence of Aboriginal occupation and early European settlement.

While camping, caravanning and other facilities are not available as yet, Belmont Wetlands is currently used by beachgoers and fishing enthusiasts.

Location

Belmont Wetlands is two hours drive north of Sydney, and 25 minutes drive south of Newcastle.

Things to do

- Ocean fishing for flathead and bream
- Take a stroll or swim at the beautiful local beaches
- Visit the stunning Lake Macquarie where you can enjoy boating, sailing, swimming or simply stroll along the esplanades
- Enjoy bush walking or bird watching with over 113 species in the area
