## Grabine Lakeside

Wyangala Dam is an oasis in the middle of the Central West. With a water storage capacity in excess of 1,217,000 megalitres, 2.5 times the volume of Sydney Harbour, the catchment area measures 8,300 square kilometres. Visitors from all over the state soak up the stunning rural landscape on the north-east shores of Lake Wyangala at Grabine Lakeside State Park. Enjoy the magnificent views of Grabine and Lake Wyangala or enjoy water sports, bushwalking and picnics.

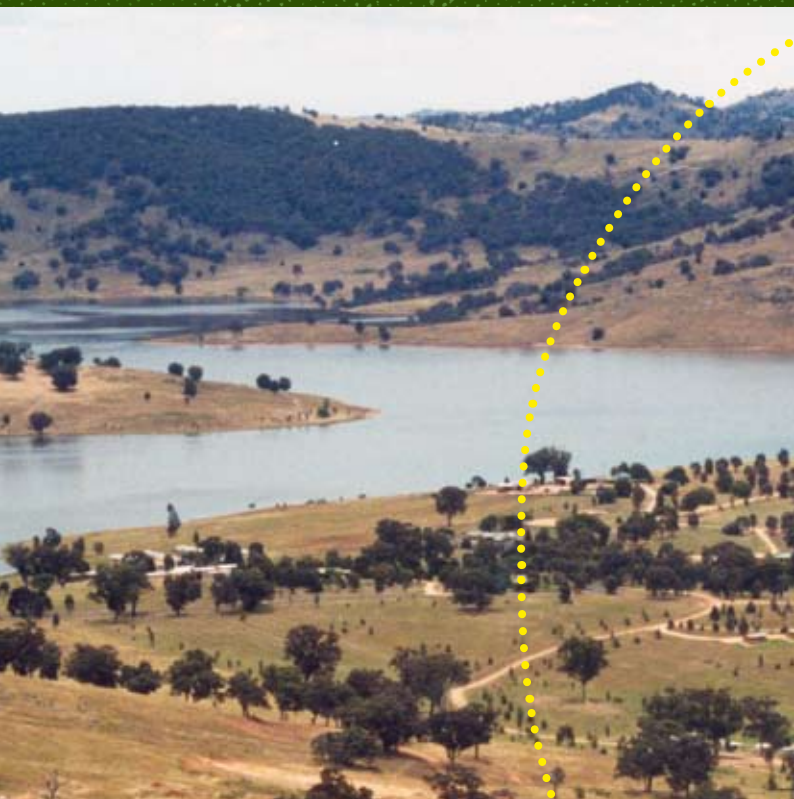
### Location

Only a couple of hours drive from Canberra, or about four hours from Sydney, Grabine Lakeside is 83kms north-west of the Southern Tablelands town of Crookwell. Centrally located between Goulburn, Bathurst and Cowra, it is 122kms from Goulburn via the Bigga Road.

  - Explore the quaint village of Bigga, in the heart of fine wool country, meet the locals at the golf club or the friendly Federal Hotel
