Manning Entrance

The 450 hectare site runs from Old Bar to the southern side of the Manning River's northern entrance at Manning Point and features a caravan park, primitive campground, sporting fields and historic airstrip.

The foreshores of the coastal beaches and estuary provide an array of year round recreation and tourism opportunities while the protected tracts of littoral rainforests and other significant native vegetation provide habitat for many species of native fauna and flora.

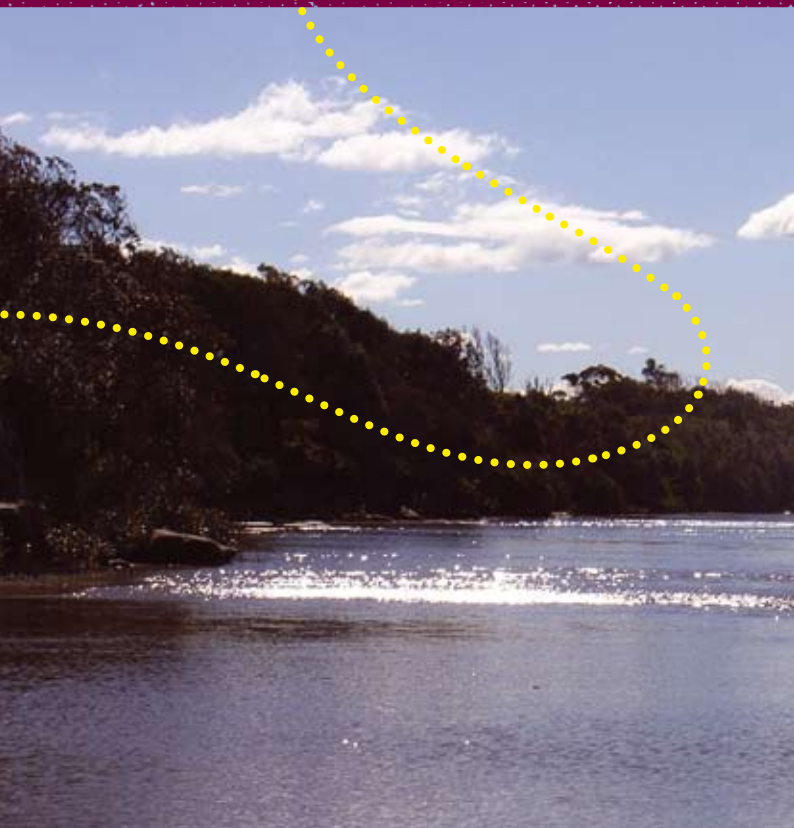
Location

Manning Entrance State Park is located on the Mid North Coast of NSW, about a 3.5 hour drive north of Sydney and about 2 hours from Newcastle. The park is north of the popular seaside village of Old Bar.
