

Killalea

Less than two hours south of Sydney, Killalea State Park is over 250 hectares of pristine coastal reserve with some of the best beaches on the NSW South Coast. With 8kms of coastline, rainforest areas, extensive wetlands and seabird breeding areas, Killalea is popular for camping, day trips, educational groups, canoeing, surfing and fishing.

Location

Killalea State Park is located between the coastal towns of Kiama and Shellharbour, 90kms south of Sydney. It's a short drive from Wollongong or a few hours from Canberra.

Things to do

- Enjoy walking trails through littoral rainforest areas or along extensive estuarine wetlands and seabird breeding areas
- Try swimming and surfing at two of the best surf beaches on the South Coast or relax at picnic and BBQ areas
- Beach, estuary and rock fishing is available, as is offshore fishing
- Shellharbour offers lawn bowling, golf, skateboarding and tennis, as well as sea sports. There's a light rail (tramways) and a railway museum, and the Tongarra Bicentennial Museum features pioneering and historical exhibits
- Go to Kiama to see the amazing natural formation of the Kiama blowhole, where the sea spray shoots high into the air. There are scenic views from Saddleback Mountain and lush foliage in the Minnamurra Rainforest
- Shellharbour and Kiama also offer plenty of cafes, restaurants, shops, hotels and supermarkets
