Nature lovers and bushwalkers alike will enjoy the woodland, which provides a habitat for over 100 species of birds, as well as water sports, fishing, picnic areas, BBQs, playgrounds, tennis and boat hire.

A 3.5 hour drive from Sydney, Lake Glenbawn State Park is 160kms north-west of Newcastle, just off the New England Highway, and can be reached via Aberdeen or Scone.
