The 'Jewel in the crown of the Central West', Wyangala Waters is a favourite picnic area and holiday destination. Relax in comfortable accommodation or on the water in a houseboat, take a bushwalk or cast a line for some fishing. An easy morning's drive from Sydney, or a short drive from Canberra, Wyangala Dam is located at the junction of the Lachlan and Abercrombie Rivers. With a catchment area of 8,288 square kilometres and a dam capacity of 1,217,600 megalitres, the surface area of the dam is two and a half times the size of Sydney Harbour.

Wyangala Waters State Park is a 3.5 hour drive from Sydney, a 30-minute drive from Cowra and a two-hour drive from Canberra.
